his first week of competition. He opened with back to back triples and took a double on #3. The bottom dropped out on #4 as he added 5 extra strokes over par. He nailed a par on #5, the second par 5 and another par on #7. He stuck the green close enough to take closest to the pin for the 'B' flight. He finished with a triple on #8 and double on #9. Greg notched (2) pars. Nice effort Greg. **Mike Kove** also returns after a few years off. He was steady then and comes back steady again. Mike had a few holes that cropped up and bit him with doubles. 4 to be exact. He made doubles on #3, then 5, 6 & 7. The first hole clipped him for his only triple of the round. Again, he played steady and I expect him to get back into some lower rounds in the 40's. Mike finished with a (50).

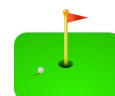
