GOLFING TIPS - PUTTING

- 1. LEAD WITH YOUR LEFT**
If you shot a free throw with your right hand only, you'd realize you need your left hand as a guide. The same is true on the greens: The left hand is the direction hand, and it's just as important as the right. Practice putting left-hand-only (*right*), or have someone hold a club in front of your hands on the target line. Bump the grip with the back of your hand,

not your fingers.

2. THINK ROLL, NOT HIT

The key to distance control is to roll the ball, not hit it. To do this, take an open stance, your weight slightly favoring your left side and your putter shaft leaning toward the target. The open stance makes it easier to feel the left hand going out and down the target line. The forward lean offsets the 4 degrees of loft I recommend for a putter and helps the ball roll smoothly. When you make the stroke, keep the putter head low to the ground past impact. The putter will ascend slightly, but don't try to hit up on the ball -- whoever told you to do that was wrong, because it makes the ball hop.
