Get The Ball Rolling

If you are not chipping to get over something, then consider putting it. During chipping, you may chip to stop, check, back up, walk, or run the golf ball. While chipping, imagine tossing pennies to a specific spot. That is the image your mind should have while in the chipping

process. Once you hit the spot, how far will the ball need to roll to get to the cup?

Don't Blade It

Your left wrist (for right-handed players) should never move during the chipping process. If it does you will blade the ball. Your right wrist (Right hand for left-handed players should never move.
