He added a couple doubles to go with a couple of bogeys. Good try Denny K. Denny O put his only par on the card on hole #4. Back to back triples caused excessive damage to his round, posting them on 1 & 2. He added another triple on 8 and double on 9. Good try Denny O.

B3: Steve Fleck (50) / Ernie Danos (44): Steve has been posting upper fifties rounds for the last several weeks, but turned it around with a nice (50) in week 15. Steve nailed two pars, one on 4 and the other on 9. Steve got stung by two triples and 3 doubles that took the round out of the forties. Still a nice round and good shooting Steve. Walter just couldn't seem to get on track, adding a couple of doubles and two bogeys. A valiant effort Walter.

The Zones Of The Putter - Tips to help your game

All putts should be attempted from the center of the [putter](#) . But on breaking putts (right-to-left and left-to-right), the zones of the putter come into play.

If you strike the ball on the "heel" zone of the putter, on a downhill left-to-right putt, the physics of this stroke will create a putt that will start a little farther left than you might have intended. But, this will give you more chances of making the putt.

Likewise if you strike the ball on the "toe" zone of the [putter](#) , on a downhill right-to-left putt, the physics of the stroke will create a putt that will start a little farther to the right than you might have intended. But, it will give you more of a chance to stay above the hole during the putt.
