Team #B1: Rick Berschbach (45) / Kevin Ressler (53): Rick continues to stay around the mid forties rounds, coming in in week 10 with a (45). Rick played bogey golf until he reached the first par three, hole #12 where it cost him a triple bogey. After the bogey on #13, hole #14 clipped him for a double. Back to back pars helped the round till #17 bit him for another double. He finished 18 with a par. Good effort and round Rick. Kevin had a better round last week, knocking off 4 strokes as he came into the clubhouse with a (53). Kevin got away with a bogey on #10 but paid for it with a triple on #11. The next three holes did enough damage to keep him from getting into the clubhouse with a round under 50. A double, triple and double elevated his round score. He bogeyed 15 and 16 before finishing off the round with a double on #17 and triple on #18. Good try Kevin.

Team #B3: Ernie Danos (HC51) / Steve Fleck (HC53): Both players were absent and handicap cards were used to calculate the point totals against their opponents.

Team #B4: Billy Alessandrini (Sub-Trevor Vallus (39) / Norm Giraud (58): Trevor subbed for Billy (who has taken over for Larry temporarily) and came in with a very nice 4 over par (39). After a double on #10 and bogey on #11, Trevor strung together 4 straight pars. He made back to back bogeys on #16 and #17 and drained a birdie putt on #18. Very nice shooting Trevor. Norm had troubles right from #10, as he limped in with a (58). Hole ten cost him four extra shots and he followed that up with a double on #11. He posted a bogey on #12 and then everything went south again. A double on #13 was followed up with a quad on #14 and back to back doubles on 15

and 16. He tripled #17 and finished 18 with a final double. A valiant effort Norm.

Team #B5: Dan D'Amato (41) / Joe DePasquale (HC59): Dan turned in a very nice round on the back nine in week 10, coming into the 19th hole with a (41). Dan nailed an opening par on #10 and then got stung by a triple on #11, costing him a chance to drop into the 30's. He bogey 12 and 13 and dropped a par putt in on tough #14. A bogey followed on #15 and then three straight pars to cap off a nice round. Good shooting Dan. Pastor Joe was unable to make the league night and a handicap card was used to match up against his opponent.

Team #B6: Marc Blair (57) / Ryan Atkinson (53): Marc knocked off three strokes from the previous week, coming into the clubhouse with a (57). The first

five holes on the card looked like a canasta hand showing 5 of a kind. Unfortunately, it cost Marc 16 extra strokes on the card. He bogeyed #15 and #16 before finishing with back to back doubles. Good try Marc. For the second week in a row, Ryan came into the watering hole with a (53). Like many others, hole number 10 seems to cost several of the players several extra strokes and Ryan got bit by a triple. After a couple of bogeys, trouble cropped up again. He put a double on the card on #13, a quad on troublesome #14 and a triple on #15. He bogeyed #16, and doubled the #1 handicap hole #17. He finished his card with a bogey on #18. Striking The Ball

PUTTING TIPS TO HELP YOUR GAME

The putter must stay down through the ball to keep it on line. If it goes off to the right, you may have moved your head. Keep your head still especially on short putts. Before you putt, how do you pick a target? I look at the part of the cup I want the ball to roll over going in the cup. Look only at that part of the cup you want the ball to roll over going in the cup. Once you see it clearly then look away to the ball. Now, focus on striking the ball solid and at the target. Remember the part of the cup you want the ball to roll over going in. Now imagine where the ball will have to come from to go in on that side or part of the cup. This is your line. This is the line you will be trying to putt your ball on, so choose it carefully. Once you have seen the line, find a spot in front of the ball that will aim you in that direction and line up on that spot. Next, think only of how hard - or better yet, the distance - you will have to stroke the ball. **This is most important in golf putting.** It determines how short or how far past you will roll the ball. This is why we practice!

You don't have to look back. Your mind can hold the target without another look. Trust me! This seems like a lot of things to do and to remember. But that's what the routine is all about. Practice for feel and distance, as well as the routine. This is how to get it all right before you putt the ball. **Next week** "[The Zones Of The Putter](#)"
