Team #B1: Kevin Ressler (60) / Rick Berschbach (46): Kevin's rounds look like they are on a

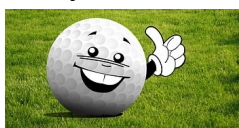

Good shooting Ernie</p> <p>TIPS FOR A BETTER GAME:</p> <p><u>Your Eyes</u> For perfect golf putting, your left eye (or your right eye for left-handed players) should be directly over the ball. To check this, take another ball and put it directly under the eye in question and drop it. If it hits the ball you are putting, then you are in the correct position. Now, turn your head only to look for the line.</p> <p><u>Judging Distance</u> Walk to the middle of the putt to see the true distance. The true line is seen from behind the ball. For example, you cannot see the true length of a <u>club</u> by looking at it from the <u>grip</u>. Same thing with a putt. For short putts, grip down on the club. For long</p>		
<p>putts, grip the end of the club and stand tall while widening your stance.</p> <p>To target your putts, find a spot or mark that is one to two feet in front of the ball. The spot must be on the line to the target side of the hole.</p> <p>Remember this mark. This is what you will line up on to make your putt.</p> <p>Now, practice this - one point at a time - until you get all the golf putting points together in a routine. Practice how you play and play like you practice.</p> <p>Good luck and practice, practice and practice!!</p>
