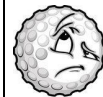
Team #A6: Billy Alessandrini

Both Chad and Mike were unable to make league night and handicap cards were used to post against their opponents.

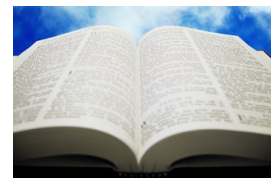
Team #A8: Dan D'Amato (44) / Nate Hood (46):
