After a tough week 4, both Bill and Kirk posted some much better rounds. Kirk put together a very nice (41). Kirk was on a par roll for the first three holes before getting stopped by back to back bogeys on #13 & #14. Even with the bogeys, it

Warren finished his last three holes with bogeys to end the round on a sour note. Good effort and try Warren. Jim dropped off 10 strokes from last weeks round as he cruised in with a very nice (44). Three holes cost him a much lower round. The opening two were back to back doubles. He reduce the overage with a very nice birdie on hole #12, dropping in a 15 foot putt. He bogeyed his way on #13, #14 & #15 before stopping them with a par on #16. The 17th hole cost him a triple, but he finished positive with a par on #18. Very nice shooting Jim.

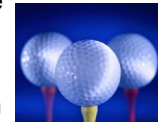

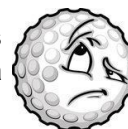


pars on #11 and #18 with the remainder of the card filled in with three doubles. Good effort and try Chris.
